CARGO STOWAGE AND SECURING

Introduction

Cargo operation is a specialized area in any merchant ship where safety of operations is considered prime concern. There are great risks to safety at sea and to individual seafarers if untrained workers are responsible for the loading and discharging a ship. Ship's Officers who are designated for handling cargoes are trained in the area of loading, discharging and stowage of cargo for ships, because of the nature of different types of cargo, cargo's effect on the ships stability, as well as the cargo operational equipment. Participants will be made aware of the safety features of cargo working gear, risks associated with dangerous goods, importance of proper stowage, types of cargo securing equipment and the how the cargo's stowage location affects the ships stability.

Objectives

The purpose of this training is to provide the required knowledge, skill and understanding of

- Cargo gears and its usage
- Different types of cargo
- Proper stowage planning and care of different types of cargoes
- The types of derricks, cranes and hatch covers
- Rigging methods of Tackles and Purchases
- Safe Working Practices

Classrooms will be used for lecturing, various cargo equipment for practical identification of cargo gears, Wooden and metal blocks, ropes and shackles and practical demonstration using ship models for familiarization various equipment's.

All candidates will need to pass the written assessments and demonstrate practically their understanding of required cargo equipment to be competent.
