INTRODUCTION

This training provides the grounding knowledge not only to perform navigation duties but also to act as managers and leaders to the vessels crew and colleagues as well as interact with external parties linked to the vessels operation. It is vital that they possess the knowledge and ability of managing people, planning and coordinating activities on board, as well as making the right decisions through proper judgment and analysis of the situation. Due to the demanding tasks of ships officers performing critical tasks for the smooth operation of the vessel, this training, integrates Watch keeping theory, practical application and problem solving exercises to enable Students to develop skills and knowledge to carry out watch keeping duties and respond appropriately to emergency and operational requirements of their vessel.

PRE-REQUISITE

The candidate needs to have completed:

- Deck Cadet Officer training and has the appropriate sea time approved by NMSA
- Mate or Master class 5 and has met the required sea time and capacity according to NMSA

THE OBJECTIVE OF THE COURSE

This training integrates watch keeping theory, practical application and problem solving exercises to enable candidates to have the required knowledge, understanding and skills to competently perform navigation watch duties or take command on vessels ranging up to 200 GT engaged in the domestic trade.

COURSE OUTCOME

After successful completion of the course the trainee will have the understanding and competency to perform officer of navigation watch duties or take command of vessels ranging up to 200 GT engage in near coastal trade.

COURSE OUTLINE

This training will cover the following areas.

- 1. Navigation and position determination
- 2. Cargo operations
- 3. Vessel construction
- 4. Vessel stability
- 5. Instrumentation and navigation aids
- Radar
- 7. Visual communication

TRAINING FACILITIES

Classroom lessons and simulation activities are to be closely related to the ships navigation bridge, cargo operation and related sea environment.

CERTIFICATES

Prior to obtaining a Mate Class 4 Certificate of Competency, the following requirements are to be met:

- a) Has the approved sea service
- b) Successfully passed all assessments as required by the Authority
- c) Successfully passed the Oral examination administered by the Authority.
- d) All other statutory requirements that all PNG Seafarers are required to comply with.
